All in recognition of our many volunteers ... thank you!






Taking Pride

We have a bridge club that we are all proud to call our home.

We have many teachers and volunteers that we are all proud to call our own. We asked Audrey Craig, one of our esteemed teachers, what she teaches about overcalls.

Her reply, "An overcall is a suit that you are proud of."

An overcall should be a **5 card suit or longer**, with at least two honors. It does not have to have opening values. (7-16 HCP). Partner now has valuable information, should he/she be on lead.



Now to the hand that brought about this conversation.

I hold 13 points and some hearts. My left-hand opponent opened one club. My partner overcalled one heart. I know she/he has a 5 card suit with two honors. What should I bid - because I'm really proud of my support for partner's suit?
